GENERAL QUALITIES

Clifton High School are seeking an enthusiastic, dedicated, and highly skilled Sports Coach with a specialism in Netball to join our dynamic school sports programme. This is an exciting opportunity for a passionate individual to inspire and develop young athletes, fostering a love for sport and physical activity in a supportive and inclusive environment.

SAFEGUARDING

All staff at Clifton High will be committed to Safeguarding and promoting the welfare of children and young people across this 3-18 School, both in and out of the School. They will also ensure that any volunteers they have engaged to work with the children and young people are also committed to Safeguarding and are fully aware of the School's policies and procedures beforehand.



TERMS AND CONDITIONS SPECIFIC TO THE ROLE

- This is a fixed term contract to cover the netball season (to Easter 2026) but could be extended for a further term for a candidate who is able to coach a summer term sport.
- Between 10 and 16 hours per week, including Saturday mornings.

MAIN RESPONSIBILITIES

Key Responsibilities

- Plan and deliver engaging and inclusive netball coaching sessions for students of varying abilities.
- Lead school netball teams in training and competitive fixtures as directed by the Head of Games
- Assist in the delivery of other sports as part of the school's PE and extracurricular programme.
- · Promote teamwork, sportsmanship, and a positive sporting culture.
- Ensure the safety and wellbeing of all students during sports activities.
- Collaborate with Director of Sport, Head of Games, PE staff and other coaches to support the wider sports programme.
- Maintain equipment and ensure facilities are used appropriately.

DEPARTMENT INFORMATION

General information

The Core Physical Education and sports' Games Sessions are timetabled lessons for all students within Years 1-11 and the School runs a full senior games programme for all Y11-13. Whilst we are proud of our achievements, it is paramount that all students are given the opportunity to participate and progress, as well as developing a lifelong interest in physical activity and sport. Fundamentally, we want our pupils and students to enjoy being active and look to promote a 'Sport for all, with a pursuit of excellence' ethos.

The School offers a full schedule of competitive sporting fixtures in Hockey, Rugby, Netball, Football and Cricket along with some high level Swimming, Cross Country, Basketball and Tennis fixtures. The PE and Sports department takes pride in all the sporting achievements of our pupils and students, and we have had some considerable success in team and individual sports at local, national and international level. Our talented sportspeople are entered for county trials, local, regional and national tournaments and our support network for the pupils is highly regarded. Our unique partnership with Bristol Sport and The University of Bristol, as well as our links and contacts with local clubs and sports' governing bodies, provides consistency and clear player pathways into elite competition, while ensuring pupils and students of all abilities have the opportunity to access sports across every ability range, both in and outside of School.

Our Facilities

Through our current partnership with the University of Bristol, the school makes full use of the facilities at Coombe Dingle, which consist of a 38 acre site, just 10 minutes drive from the School. All pupils are driven by coach or minibus to the site for their sessions, as well as weekly after-school session and fixtures for Senior School pupils.

Facilities available off site include:

- 3G pitch
- Artificial pitches (sand dressed and floodlit)
- Grass pitches (football and rugby)
- Cricket squares and nets (including grass)
- Tennis courts, indoor and outdoor (floodlit)
- Netball courts (outdoor)
- Pavilion

All PE lessons and some Games sessions take place on the school site. We are proud of our sporting facilities, which include:

- · A gymnasium which includes a climbing wall
- · Cardio and weights fitness suites
- An indoor, heated swimming pool
- A MUGA (Multi-Use Games Area) which is floodlit, and is marked out for either two tennis or two netball courts
- An astro-turfed outdoor playground and training area.

Additional Information

The department is heavily involved in a number of other areas across the wider scope of School life. There are House tournaments organised in all major sporting activities giving pupils a further opportunity to develop their competitiveness whilst working with others who do not necessarily play in a school team. There are numerous local, regional and international sporting tours undertaken by the department. These tours provide the pupils and students with different opportunities, challenges and lifelong memories of competing for their School in diverse cultures and environments. Annual whole School sporting events take place over the year, like Sports Day, alongside awards and celebration events. The department also manages the Sports Scholars programme and the Sports Podium lecture series, which looks to extend and challenge our more gifted sportspeople. The successful applicant will be expected to contribute to all of these.
